Jacob is a third-year candidate from Houston in his junior year at Marquette University. In Memory of Msgr. Michael Yarbrough

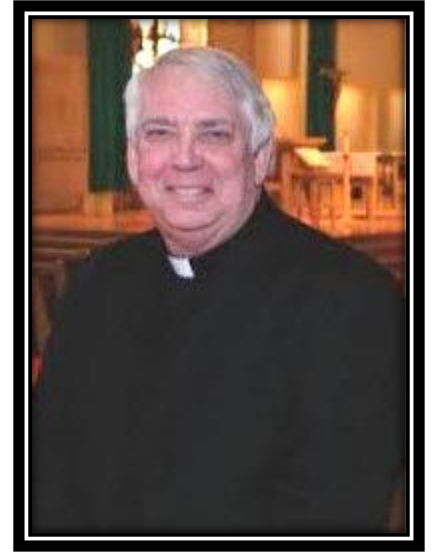

May Msgr. Yarbrough and the souls of all our faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

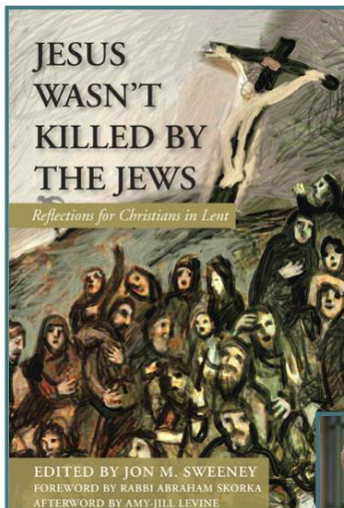

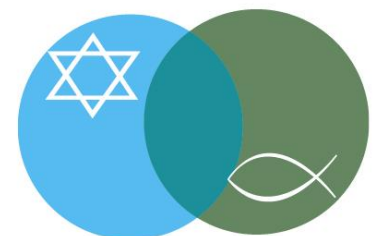
